



CHC43315 Certificate IV in Mental Health

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This nationally recognised qualification reflects the role of workers who provide self-directed recovery-oriented support for people affected by mental illness and psychiatric disability. Work involves implementing community-based programs and activities focusing on mental health, mental illness and psychiatric disability.

Work is undertaken in a range of community contexts such as community based non-government organisations; home based outreach; centre-based programs; respite care; residential services, rehabilitation programs; clinical settings; or supporting people in employment. Work is carried out autonomously under the broad guidance of other practitioners and professionals.

Gallang Education & Training requires that potential students for this qualification are currently employed (or volunteering) in the community services and health industry supporting Aboriginal communities. This ensures work placement requirements and assessment conditions that skills be demonstrated in the workplace or in a simulated environment are met.

Course Costs	<p>a) Fee for Service - \$5,100 (Fee payment plans available)</p> <hr/> <p>b) State Government Funding</p> <p>The Department of Youth Justice, Employment, Small Business & Training (DYJESBT) funds this qualification under the Queensland VET Investment Program (Higher Level Skills).</p> <p>Eligibility Criteria for this financial support – the applicant MUST:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Be no longer at school. ▪ Be aged 18 years or older. ▪ Permanently reside in Queensland. ▪ Be an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen, and ▪ Not hold, and not be enrolled in, a certificate IV or higher-level qualification, not including qualifications completed at school and foundation skills training. <p>If you are eligible for funding, you will still be required to pay the following 'Student Contribution Fee':</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Concessional Student - \$300 ▪ Non-Concessional Student - \$600 <p>If you complete this qualification under the DYJESBT Higher Level Skills program, you will not be eligible to access further funding under the same program.</p>
