



CHC43315 Certificate IV in Mental Health (Rel.3)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This nationally recognised qualification reflects the role of workers who provide self-directed recovery-oriented support for people affected by mental illness and psychiatric disability. Work involves implementing community based programs and activities focusing on mental health, mental illness and psychiatric disability.

Work is undertaken in a range of community contexts such as community based non-government organisations; home based outreach; centre-based programs; respite care; residential services, rehabilitation programs; clinical settings; or supporting people in employment. Work is carried out autonomously under the broad guidance of other practitioners and professionals.

Gallang Education & Training offers this course/training to community members who are currently employed (or volunteering) in the community organisations, mental health and health services industry, or those that are looking into joining the community services workforce.

If you are not working in Mental Health or in the health community, you will need to complete at least 80hrs of work whether as a volunteer or a paid worker in the sector.

No licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

Eligibility	<p>Qualification or Experience Requirement:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preferably already held a Certificate II or III in a vocational qualification, preferably in Health. • If you don't have that, you need to have at least 2 years of experience working in the Community Sector. <p>Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Quiz:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All applicants will need to complete an LLN quiz and obtain a satisfactory score • This is to assess your reading, writing and math skills. • Based on your results, we'll decide how much support you'll need to complete the qualification. <p>If we feel that you did not reach a satisfactory level of LLN skills, we will need to refer you to another Institution for more learning or a lower level qualification to avoid anxiety and disappointment.</p>

a) State Government Funding

The Department of Trade, Employment and Training (DTET), subsidises this qualification under the DTET Training Priorities Plan, for those that are eligible.

Eligibility Criteria for this financial support – the applicant MUST:

- aged 15 years or older;
- not be a school student;
- permanently reside in Queensland;
- be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- not already have a certificate IV or higher qualification (including tertiary qualification) completed within the last 10 years (qualifications completed as a school student and foundation skills qualifications do not count).
- **Note:** This eligibility requirement does not apply to individuals seeking to enrol in a skill set; not be enrolled in another qualification, even if it is on hold or deferred, whether funded by DTET or not (foundation skills qualifications do not count).

If you are eligible for QLD Government funding, you will still be required to pay the following 'Student Contribution Fee':

- Concessional Student - \$300
- Non-Concessional Student - \$600

(The above fees must be paid before the start of the course – Please seek help if you have financial difficulties)

If you complete this qualification under the DTET Career Boost program, you may not be eligible to access further funding under the same program.
